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Finance FAQ's

How do I get new rent coupons?

Rent payment coupons are not automatically mailed to you; before you run out of coupons, call Leah in Finance at 897-1039 or come in to request them.

If my rent changes, do I need new coupons?

No, keep using the coupons you have; the coupons identify you by the lease number listed on them, not by your apartment number or dollar amount.

Is there a charge if I lose my coupons?

Yes, there is a \$6 charge.

Is it faster to pay rent at the office or the bank?

The bank; if you pay at the office, your payment may not be taken to the bank that same day.

Reminder to Residents... The Importance of Fire Safety

A recent fire in an apartment has reminded us of the need to emphasize the importance of fire safety among our residents. Thankfully, in the incident that occurred, there were no injuries or loss of life. However, there was extensive damage and loss of property for both the residents and the Housing Authority. According to the lease, residents are responsible for the continued and proper operation of smoke detectors in their apartment. Additionally, we encourage all residents to acquire renter's insurance as the Housing Authority, save for gross negligence on our part, does not cover the loss of contents in any sort of accident or incident whether it is fire, flooding, etc. To ensure your personal belongings are covered you must have renter's insurance. If you would like assistance in acquiring renter's insurance, please call Resident Services at 897-1044.

A few tips for maintaining smoke detectors:

- Test smoke alarms at least monthly by pushing the test button.
- Change the batteries when you change your clock when the time changes.
- Pay attention to any chirping, beeping or lights from the smoke detector; these may indicate it is failing.
- Dust or vacuum all unit covers when performing battery maintenance. Debris and dust will make the detectors less sensitive.

Providing housing to families is one thing—but we discovered that many of the families we assist move into their new homes with little or no furnishings. The Housing Authority's Department of Resident Services began working diligently with local non-profit organizations, private businesses and citizens of Santa Barbara to secure home furnishing donations. These donations are set aside for recently housed families, seniors and disabled residents in need. Everything from kitchenware, sofas, dressers, tables, chairs and televisions have been donated. Work Orders and Minors

When you call to request a work order, the Housing Authority's Property Development Department goes to a lot of effort to complete the work in a timely However, if you have minor manner. children home alone in your apartment, the Housing Authority's policy is that Property and Development staff will not enter without an adult being present to complete the work. An adult 18 years of age or older needs to be present, and may or may not be a family member. Analog to Digital TV Change

After February 2009, television stations will begin broadcasting solely in digital. As a result, television sets that use "rabbit ears" or rooftop antennas will need to acquire a converter box to continue receiving broadcasts. The Federal government is offering households up to two \$40 coupons towards the purchase of converter boxes. These converters will allow current analog televisions to receive the digital broadcasts after February 17, 2009. For more information call (888)-DTV-2009 or go online at www.DTV2009.gov.
